There are 2 villages; Japan and Kuwukan Villages in Dawe subdistrict, 18 km from Kudus –Central Java have no clean water facility. The people in those villages really need this clean water facility and our clubs saw the possibility to install pipings and reservoirs from the spring (water source) to flow the clean water to the above mentioned villages. 43% of the children diseases can be avoided by washing hand before meal. But there are a lot of schools in Sidoarjo area, East Java, Indonesia, which have no clean water. This global grant will also provide clean water project and sanitation to 2 schools in that area.

Rotarians of those 2 clubs plan to take water from a spring by installing pipes from the spring to the Village. This project will be beneficial to most of the people because the clean water and sanitation will keep a healthy lifestyle in these villages including drinking, bathing, and washing.

Rotarians of RC Surabaya Metropolitan surveyed to Sidoarjo area where it was difficult to get clean water, and visited the schools to know the condition of each, chose two of them which really need clean water urgently.

The school will allocate some school operational fund as maintenance fee for this project. The spare or replacement parts are very common and available at the local market, except the items with Rotary logo and sponsors' name which need longer delivery time.

The teachers and employees will be trained to operate and maintain the equipments. Rotarians in both locations will periodically monitor and supervise the project.

Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund of any global grant funds, including any interest earned, that have not been expended.
